I moved to the Twin Cities out of college for my first job. I found a place to live and I looked diligently for a place to worship. Because I was LCMS, I looked for an LCMS church. I visited quite a few before I found one that felt like home. It was hard. I went in by myself. I sat by myself. There were times that I felt eyes boring into my back as I must have inadvertently sat in someone's pew. But I was determined to find a church home before my mom died. That was one of her dying wishes for me. My transfer from my congregation in Winona was official on August 1, and she died on August 12.

I was determined to find a church, but that is not "normal" anymore. Unfortunately, statistics show that church participation in mainline protestant denominations is declining across the board. And denominational loyalty is not what it used to be either. Just because one grows up Lutheran doesn't mean that you won't eventually be Methodist, or Presbyterian, or any other denomination. Growing up in church doesn't guarantee you'll end up in ANY church. Then there are the very loud voices of Evangelical far right "Christians" who are so very judgmental and condemning.

#### A Note from the Desk of Pastor Lisa



Our quiet voices of love and welcome and service and compassion are lost in all the noise. Stories of clergy or church leader abuse taint all of us, no matter the denomination. No wonder people are leery of church!

The absolute best advertisement for any church is her members! What first brought you to this congregation? What keeps you? Has your relationship with Jesus deepened in this place? Do you find meaning and purpose for vour life in worship? All of us need to find that place that feels like "Cheers" - you know, where everyone knows your name. We all have a need for life-giving relationships to counter the hardships life so often hands us. That is what we can share! That is what we need to share! If we are silent and say nothing about our faith and what it means to us, those around us will not know. Then the loud and vocal minority will continue to drive people away from all churches.

Does your neighbor go to church? Have you asked them to come with you? How about your brother-in-law, or aunt, or cousin or . . . ? Have you invited them to come with you? How about that coffee Klutch you are with every week. If you don't invite them, who will?

Got a couple of opportunities for you this month.

On **August 11**, Artaria will be in worship to provide special music. (They are part of the Stringwood Chamber Music Festival held every year.)

What better way to invite someone? "Say, we've got this musical group coming on the 11th, would you like to come?" On **August 25**, we will be doing "Church on the Farm" at the Edward and Katie Ruen barn. Easy time to say, "Come and see."

I know it's a challenge! We Lutherans haven't been called the "Frozen Chosen" for no reason. We all have forgotten how to share the good news. We all are sometimes afraid to talk church (or politics) for fear of offense. Now is the time that needs to change! If church and faith and hope are important to you, they need to be shared. Our families, our community and our world need the positive vision for the future that Jesus gives us.

This is the offering prayer we recently used – let us pray again: Loving God, Your church is composed of people like me. I help make it what it is. It will be friendly, if I am. Its pews will be filled, if I help fill them. It will do great work, if I work. It will make generous gifts to many causes, if I am a generous giver. It will bring other people into its worship and fellowship, if I invite and bring them. It will be a church where people grow in faith and serve you, if I am open to such growth and service. Therefore, with your help Lord, we shall dedicate ourselves to the task of being all the things you want your church to be. Amen.

#### WELCA Requests Donations for Kits

Imagine having to choose between a meal or purchasing a notebook. Lutheran World Relief school kits are sent to places where even the few required school supplies may be more than a family can afford. Your donation of pencils and paper can help write a positive future!

School supplies are on sale right now. Please see the list of specific supplies needed for each school kit. Place supplies in the drawstring bags that are available in the narthex.

Lutheran World Relief is also in need of personal care kits, baby care kits and fabric kits. Please see a List of items to be included in each kit.

### Please compile kits

The WELCA asks for your donations to fill kits for Lutheran World Relief. Items should be brought to church any time until the end of September to be included in this year's shipment to LWR.

Please do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove excess packaging.

## Each personal care kit should include:

- ✓ One bath-size towel (approximately 52" x 27") preferably a dark color
- ✓ Two bath-size bars of soap in original wrapper
- ✓ One adult-size toothbrush in original wrapper\*

- ✓ One sturdy comb (remove wrapper)
- ✓ One metal nail clipper attached file optional (remove wrapper)

\*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.

Wrap all items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

#### Each school kit should include:

- ✓ Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper approximately 8 x 10 ½ inch. No loose-leaf paper.
- ✓ One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- ✓ One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ✓ One pencil sharpener
- ✓ Five new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- ✓ One eraser approximately 2 ½ inches long
- ✓ Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no ink gel); secure together with a rubber band
- ✓ One box of 16 or 24 crayons

Place items in a drawstring backpack available in the narthex.

#### Each fabric kit should include:

- ✓ Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (No knits or 100% polyester).
- ✓ Fabric should be cut into pieces measuring either 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>

- yds of 60" wide fabric or 3 yds of 44" wide or 4 yds of 36" wide.
- ✓ Two spools of neutralcolored general-purpose thread, 250-300 yards each.

Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second piece of fabric and tie with yarn.

## Each baby care kit should include:

- ✓ Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- ✓ Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- ✓ Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- ✓ One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- ✓ Two pairs of socks
- ✓ One hand towel, dark color recommended
- ✓ Two or three bath-size bars (equal to 8-9 oz) of gentle soap, in original wrapper
- ✓ Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Gently used, clean items can be substituted for new ones. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins. Do not put in plastic bags. Sizes should be 3-6 to 24 months.
