In English, Norwegian, Swedish, Spanish, Swahili, and more, I know the word for "Welcome". However, even more important than the word is the feeling of welcome. One knows when welcome is extended and meant.

It has been less than a month since I "arrived on your doorstep" as my grandma loved to say. In that time, I have certainly felt your warm welcome. The way you have introduced yourselves and offered your knowledge, time, and assistance has not only made me feel at home, but has also given me a sense of calm and comfort. Thank you for that!

October lends itself to us all finding what brings us a sense of calm and comfort. For



some, it will be pumpkin spice anything. For others, October means "sweater weather" or other cozy articles of clothing, It's a time of shorter days, but



more light inside through candles or fires.

Why do we seek comfort? We need look no further than the definition of the word. Comfort gives strength and hope and eases grief and trouble.

It is consolation, a feeling of relief or encouragement,

contented well-being, and a satisfying or enjoyable experience. In other words, it is exactly the opposite of the anxiety and stress that most of us are feeling on a regular basis.

Throughout the Bible we read of God wanting comfort for God's people and providing comfort for God's people. We also read of God's people providing comfort for one another through food, clothes, medical assistance, and presence. We even read of how not to provide comfort to one another. Job, who has lost everything, is visited by his friends. Their presence is a comfort -- until they begin to speak. Their words are full of blame and distress Job further.

We do not always know what to say when it comes to comforting people, but comfort is an area in which actions can speak louder than words. Much like we do not need to say, "I am cold," to wrap a blanket around ourselves; we do not need to say, "You are sad," to hand someone a tissue. Nor do we need to reserve comfort for a special occasion.

While a new parent or a grieving family appreciate the hot dish brought to them, so does the person caring for a parent or the busy family, just because it makes day-to-day life lighter.

While I do know a lot of words for welcome. I know

more about what the action feels like and looks like than what the word in any language sounds like. You do, too. You have demonstrated that in the short time I have been here, not only to me, but also to whomever has come for worship, a meal, Bible study, and the numerous other instances we have had to welcome and mean it.


