Even without being there, I know that one of my former colleague's offices at the Nebraska Synod office will soon be filled with Grinches. One might think the reason is because he loves the book *How the Grinch Stole Christmas!* or any of the movies based on the book. The truth is less about the character than the church calendar.

For four weeks before Christmas, we celebrate the season of Advent. It is a time of waiting, preparation, and expectation. We look toward the coming of the Messiah, not only as he did as we remember with our Christmas programs, but also as he will as we recite in our Creeds. Some congregations have even returned to the former practice of observing seven weeks of Advent. Whether four or seven weeks in length, Advent is a separate season from Christmas in the church year. And, as such, it has its own color, practices, and music. This brings us to my former colleague's collection.

In one of the congregations he served, it became known that he preferred to sing Advent hymns during the season of Advent and reserve Christmas hymns until the season of Christmas (the twelve days of Christmas; December 25 through January 5). The administrative assistant with whom he worked at that time felt that was "Grinch-like" and presented him with his first Grinch. And – as happens with many collections – when people noticed he had one, they gifted him more. Soon there will be Grinches on coat rack, credenza, desk, bookshelf, door . . .

For quite some time, I thought similarly to my former colleague. There are some wonderful and underused Advent hymns and it is a short season in which to sing them.

Then, another colleague pointed out what our children are hearing throughout the season. Considering how repetition works with remembering, they know the words to "All I Want for Christmas Is You" better than "Away in a Manger".

So, Christmas will enter into Advent in our music just as it does in our decorations. We will wait for, prepare for, and expect the coming of Immanuel (God with Us) while we celebrate that God is always with us. We will sing of what has been and what will be.

And perhaps our hearts will grow three sizes . . . or at least large enough to let the Christ Child in to stay.

Hope, peace, joy, and love to you in the seasons of Advent and Christmas and all the year through.

Thursday, November 13, 2025 Bethlehem Lutheran Church of Lanesboro, MN Congregation Council Meeting

Prior to the meeting:

- a) Andrew & JoAnna Pruett brought forth a concern about a potential gas leak outside the church, due the strong smell upon arrival. Minnesota Energy called to inspect. Arrived after meeting and concluded furnace in basement not working properly. Gas not being used efficiently and dangerously high carbon monoxide detected. Furnace shut down.
- b) Deane Benson took members to entryway to do a front door demonstration as doors have not been locked properly. Outside double doors should be locked and inside double doors should be left unlocked when closing up. This includes both the north and south doors in the Narthex.

 - c) Pastoral Report-spent a day in St. Peter with Bishop Hassanally who approved attendance at the Systems Academy-focusing on family systems theory. The Synod would pay for attendance. Pastor Heidi plans to use this to teach future classes between the SE and SW Synods. Confirmation class has had great attendance. Earlier this month, 6 confirmed. 1 funeral. Working on putting a Sunday school program together for youth. Christmas program-December 14.

Motion made by Carrie Hanson to turn dehumidifier request over to the endowment committee.
